She is also leading a PE club with children in separate bubbles weekly. She has worked with our NQTs in a coaching capacity during this lockdown and reorganized and replenished PE equipment.	Teachers' PE skills and most recently our NQTs' PE teaching skills have been developed and continue to be developed across the PE curriculum.	Our specialist teacher is working with staff to develop their skills in a programme which develops their skills for long term teaching and learning in PE.
