<ul> <li>Explore mark-making through unit printing with a variety of objects eg. Vegetables, Numicon, etc.</li> <li>Use basic pressing printing where images transfer from one surface to another (including "butterfly" prints).</li> <li>Collect, sort and use a variety of materials to print with a on.</li> <li>Experiment with different textures.</li> <li>Be able to use basic print terminology: roller, tray, paint, ink.</li> <li>Begin to look at the work of artists who have used printing in their work.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Use repeating or overlapping shapes.</li> <li>Mimic print from the environment (e.g. wallpapers).</li> <li>Use objects to create prints (e.g. fruit, vegetables or sponges).</li> <li>Carry out a range of basic printing techniques: finger, objects, relief and basic etching into polystyrene.</li> <li>Use basic press printing where paper is placed on a design.</li> <li>Use rubbings to create effects from natural and manmade surfaces and objects.</li> <li>Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.</li> <li>Begin to use printing to make repeating patterns and notice how this is used in the world around us: wrapping paper, wallpaper, etc.</li> <li>Begin to look at the work of artists who have used printing in their work.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Use layers of two or more colours.</li> <li>Replicate patterns observed in natural or built environments.</li> <li>Make printing blocks (e.g. from coiled string or glued to a block or self-adhesive foam on a block).</li> <li>Use a variety of objects to explore print effects (leaves, cotton reels, etc.)</li> <li>Make more detailed etchings in polystyrene.</li> <li>Make precise repeating patterns.</li> <li>Combine more than one printing technique in a piece of work.</li> <li>Use printing to create work inspired by real-life uses of printing e.g. wrapping paper.</li> <li>Print on a range of surfaces including paper and fabric.</li> <li>Use the work of printing artists to inspire their work.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Build up layers of colours.</li> <li>Use mono-printing techniques.</li> <li>Create an accurate pattern, showing fine detail.</li> <li>Use more detailed etching techniques using polystyrene/ clay.</li> <li>Use lino to create mono-prints in 2 or more colours.</li> <li>Use screen-printing to create images using stencils and experiment with effects.</li> <li>Explore effects using symmetry, patterns, overlaying, mixed media.</li> <li>Begin to use appropriate terminology: relief, etching, mono,</li> <li>Begin to make their own decisions about printing techniques to use and printing on different surfaces.</li> <li>Recognise where printing has been used in artists' work and use this to inspire their work.</li> </ul>
